

Application process



Choose your course

Choose your course and check the admission requirements. Visit our website at tafeinternational.wa.edu.au/courses.



Submit an application

Submit your application using the online application form on our website tafeinternational.wa.edu.au/apply.

TIWA may ask you to submit your application through a registered TIWA education agent. An agent can also help guide your student visa application. You can view a list at tafeinternational.wa.edu.au/agentfinder.



Receive offer

On receipt of your application and supporting documentation, we will assess your eligibility to study your selected course(s). We will then send you a Letter of Offer provided you meet eligibility requirements for admission and there are places available. This letter will be sent to you either directly or through the agent you have nominated.



Receive your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE)

After you have met all the conditions, signed the *Letter of Acceptance* and made payment, you will be issued your CoE. If you are using an agent, they will assist you with your visa application. Otherwise visit the Department of Home Affairs website at immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/visas/getting-a-visa/visa-finder/study.



Accept offer

To accept your offer you need to sign the *Letter of Acceptance* and make payment.



Meet conditions

You are required to meet any conditions listed in your Letter of Offer before accepting the offer and making payment.



Start your studies

When your student visa is issued you can make plans to start your studies at TIWA. Before making travel arrangements, check the orientation dates for your campus as you need to arrive in time for orientation. For orientation information please visit tafeinternational.wa.edu.au/orientation.



English packaging

TAFE courses have English level requirements to ensure you can understand, participate and succeed in your studies. If you need to improve your English skills, you can study English Language Intensive Courses for Overseas Students (ELICOS) as a packaged study pathway. You can view specific English level admission requirements on each course page at tafeinternational.wa.edu.au/courses.

If ELICOS is required, we will send you a conditional Letter of Offer outlining the number of weeks of English study you need to complete before starting your TAFE course.

While TIWA does not deliver ELICOS directly, we partner with trusted English language colleges in Perth. You choose an English language college provider and contact them directly to arrange a packaged offer that combines English studies with your TAFE course.

Pathways to university

TIWA offers you the opportunity to gain a diploma with credit towards a university degree, giving you a faster and more affordable path to entering higher education in Australia.


A TAFE to university package gives you:

- » A practical, skills-based TAFE qualification that complements your university degree, which means you can start working in your field sooner.
- » A reduction in your study load, course duration, and fees, through credit recognition, helping you save thousands compared to the fees for first year of university.
- » Access to work and industry connections, setting you up for career success by building the contacts and network to succeed.

TIWA offers a packaged option for your TAFE diploma and university bachelor degree course. You'll apply for one student visa that covers the entire package, with your university degree as the principal course.



Subject to your academic credentials and selected program of study, the following progression pathways may be undertaken within the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF):



*TAFE diplomas and advanced diplomas typically provide up to 1 year of credit towards a university bachelor degree.



Find out about recreation activities, shopping and food options on offer near your TAFE campus or plan some holidays or sightseeing trips during your holidays.



Accommodation options in Perth and regional WA

There are several accommodation options* to choose from including homestay, dedicated student housing and private rental.

Homestay

Homestay allows students to live with an Australian family. This is very popular because you can make friends, embrace the Australian lifestyle and improve your English. Homestay is available in the metropolitan area.

Student housing

City-based housing

There is dedicated student housing in the heart of downtown Perth. All places are a short walk from the shopping and entertainment precinct. Rooms range from studios to shared options, and may include a range of facilities such as common areas, communal kitchens, fitness facilities, entertainment and games rooms, study zones and rooftop terraces.

Campus villages

TIWA students over 18 years old can apply to stay in accommodation at university student villages in the suburbs of Perth (Joondalup, Mount Lawley or Murdoch) or in Bunbury (near a South Regional TAFE campus).

Private rental

Many students choose to rent a house or apartment with other students.
